What is Howrah South Point?

Howrah South Point is an Indian NGO working for the poorest of the poor, rendering services to poor handicap children and reaching to those, whom are in medical need but cannot afford, educating poor children formal and non-formal schools. That is giving education to those who cannot afford it nor are helped by the society.

This NGO was started in 1976 by Rev. Fr. Francis Laborde who was inspired to start this mission by two people, first, Blessed Fr. Antony Chevrier (1826-1879) a priest who lived at Lyons and consecrated his life to service of the poor, especially for the poor children in the beginning of Industrialization in Europe. Second, Cardinal L. T. Picachy, then the Archbishop of Kolkata. He summoned Fr. Laborde to start at Andul Road a home for poor handicapped children to which will be attached a dispensary for the poor of the locality. Since then till date poor and neglected of the society, irrespective of caste and religion have been the beneficiaries of this Organization.

Today HSP works in Providing services like, Rehabilitation of poor Handicapped children, Health Care, Education through Formal and informal schools. These services are provided through the Three Branches, Jalpaiguri, Howrah and Asansol.

ANAND BHAVAN HOME (Asansol Branch)

INTRODUCTION - Anand Bhavan Home is a destitute children home at Kalipathar (Asansol) with 75 residential students, among them 41 are girls and 34 are boys. They are basically from tribal, poor and leprosy affected families. Our aim and priority is to provide them with good education and health as a basic need for their development.

Lalkuthi Home

Lalkuthi Home is the oldest of Howrah South Point Handicapped children's Home at Howrah. This Home is for handicapped, destitute and orphan girls. They are kept here for proper care and education. Girls from age group 6 years to 18 years stay here. All girls go to outside Government School. There are 40 children (Physically handicapped – 5, Socially Challenged - 35) and 7 staff in this home.

BAKSARA H .S. P. VIDYALAYA

In this session 2019, Baksara H. S. P. Vidyalaya had enrolled 376 students in this formal School. 64 students have newly joined and other 312 students are our old students, who have registered again. 37 students of (class) level viii (eight) have completed their course and have left our school with the Transfer Certificate and have enrolled in other Government formal Schools for their further study. Few students of other classes also left our school due to change of their parents job and some migrated to their native land.



At present we have 376 students from L K G to class VIII. There are 13 teachers and one Headmaster. All the teachers are giving their full effort in teaching under the able guidance of our Education Supervisor Mrs. Sandhyasree Sah of H.S.P. These little stars are made to shine by these teachers' effort and commitments. All the children are studying well and they are very happy to learn everything that is taught here.

Celebrations -

• We had just finished our first Summative and Half yearly Exams, where 98% of students have passed. Other 2% have been absent due to sickness or unable to attend because of unavoidable reasons. Teachers prepare their lesson plans before hand and concentrate on their teaching with love and care.



• We have introduced Natural Club Activities like Literary and Arts, where the teachers teach them about literary items of poems, Speech. Debate and speech trainings on stage. They appreciated to know our common belief. We belief that Special Needs students should be placed in the General Education class room with their non-disabled peers. Case Study

Sweta Misra - Sweta Misra is 13 years old multiple disable child. She was come here just two years ago on January, 2017. When she joins to us, she would not be able to cope up in regular schooling. Her development milestone were delayed and early stage her parent realized that she is differently able child. But they do not have any idea to developmental way to their child. Last two years ago 2017 she admitted HSP Ashaneer Home. At first she used to cry all the time. Through IEP (Individual Education Programme) Training, Motor Skill Training, Occupational Therapy, Behavior Modification etc she slowly cope up and changed. Over the year she has become a friendly, well mannered and she adapted language through gesture. Expressive and Receptive language she can comprehend or express through gesture and eye contact. She is producing some sound to communicate.



Psychotherapy

Psychotherapy department is a special part in Progranalaya Special School of HSP. This department comes to the different catagories of children (MR, CP, Autistic, Microcephly, and Hydrocephaly) who need different therapies; Psychotherapy department indicates 35 children who are suffering Psychologically. We take care about suffering and pain. Our department is generally supported by French Psychologists who come to department in alternative year but this year they are yet to come.

Case study

Sonali Das - She is eight years old mental retardation girl. She was admitted 19th January, 2019. She is residential child. In the starting time she was difficult to the therapeutic border and also difficult to follow the instruction. She also less speak and hidden behind didi or dada. She hesitates to speak during the session. Gradually she changes a lot. By coming Story Therapy, Play Therapy and Clay Therapy she has learnt to socialize able to create relationship and also accepts to presence staff. She accepts also group activity. She always helps her classmates too. So, we notice the good changes in her after having therapy. Psychotherapy team is satisfied and so are his parents.

She was coming from Birbhum. Very week, malnutrition, can't walk due to dominated TB in her right leg. (Inguinal abscess & Para vertebral abscess) Surgery done on 22.8.2017 at Ekbalpur nursing home. She discharged on 25.8.2017. After that she came back at PCH. Two years she stays here. Taken ATD medicine. She improved gradually by proper food, love & care of us. When she came her weight was 13 kg. In the month of June 2019 when she back at Home, her weight was 25 kg. She can walk freely. Parents have no hope that their daughter walk again. Now they are very happy.

Name-Sk. Munna

Age-13years

Condition - He was coming from a Government home name Malipukur Samaz Unnayan Samittee on 06.10.2018. He was suffering from high fever; cough more than 3 weeks, Swelling of both legs. Could not walk properly and severe malnutrition. Diagnosis- PTB with sputam positive.

Investigation- CT-scan brain, monthly sputam test, Chest- Xray, CBNAAT test, USG abdomen, blood for RE, USG at knee joint, HIV test.

Report-Oedema is seen in left parietal region.

Treatment- Treatment started on 06.10.2018 (ATD) drugs with daily dose. He was taken medicine for 10months. He improved gradually. Nutrious food and proper care given to him. After 10 months treatment completed discharge given. We send him to the Government Home from where he was coming.

Malnutrition Children Ward

Maintenance - Grill painting, small repairing (fan, lamp, water tap, water flash of comot etc), pipeline repairing, Mosquito net repairing, Gas open servicing, Pest control, fire smoke detector checking and cleaning.

Case Study

- Name : Afrina Khatoon
 - Age: 2yrs 6 months

This patient was admitted with anal stenosis. Patient refers to pediatric surgeon. She suggested for dilatation. According to her advice anus is dilated with required dilator. Due to this problem stool could not pass in a normal way. She was very small and always crying. Now she is ok.

Age : 8 yrs.

Case - TOF, Large Subaortic VSD, Severe PS

Patient refers to Narayana Hospital for surgery. Before surgery CTVS check up done at SSKM Hospital. Dacron Patch closure, VSD in fund resection, pulmonary valvectomy RVOT augmen by TAP done on 12.07.2019 at Narayana hospital. On 16.7.2019 he back at Children ward. We are follow Doctor's advice. Gradually he was improved and back home on 25.7. 2019. Now he is ok and led his normal life. He is very happy.

Case Study

- Name : Nasima Begum
 - Age: 37 yrs

Patient has burn injury when she came in our foreshore road dispensary. Seven months ago, in Bihar when she was cocking at her home, stove was exploded and she had very bad injury. Primarily she was admitted in a hospital in Bihar. After that she came here. We found that chest portion and both arm was injured. She had contracture in many places. (neck, arm wrist).





She had pain and could not move her neck and arm. Due to this she needs plastic surgery done. Patient was send at Ekbalpur nursing home for plastic surgery done. She feels much better and can move her neck and shoulder. She needs another operation, but not now. After operation patient feel good. He improved gradually. Now the patient is happy and stays with her children.

• Name: Giyasuddin Mondal.

Age :12 yrs

Patient was suffering from Rickets 3 years. He was visited to different hospital and private doctor. His economic condition was very poor. When he came to us, it was too delay. Three months ago. After all investigation we started medicine. Surgery done, we provide medicine and advised him some nutritious food. He improved gradually.

SMCS PROGRAMME

The safe Mother and Child Health programme was started in the year of 1978 just after the inception of Howrah South Point. The basic objective of the project is to address and identify malnourished children and their Mothers. Eradication of malnutrition is one of the mottos of the programme.

Activity :

Awareness Programme - Social awareness is one of the community mobilization tools to disseminate different information to community people. SMCH have three centre and population near about twelve thousand (12000) in three centres. Most of the populations in three centres are minority, Tribal, migrant Labours family and other community members. SMCH staff members discuss different social issues like prevention & control of different communicable Disease, common Health & Hygiene issues, five steps of Hand washing, Precaution to be taken during pregnancy, Importance of balance diet for

children and pregnant mother, pre natal & post natal care and importance of immunisation for children, best feeding practice etc. After a series of awareness many pregnant mother change their practice their behaviour like in monsoon those are living in slum now they are boiling the water and after that it is consumed, they are wash their hand with soap after defecation and before taking food, most of the PM mother register their name in Health centre for three minimum Anti natal check-up in Govt. Health centre and another major impact is most of the pregnantmother delivering at Govt. Hospital or nursing home so, institutional delivery now has improved. No. of immunisation also has been improved after this intervention.

Distribution of Ration/ Supplementary Food - Every month ration has been distributed for pregnant mother and children as a supplementary Nutrition and reduces the gap of Nutrition in daily life. There are three centre, Baksara, Lalkuthi and Coal Depot. And number of beneficiary is 150, 150 and 200 respectively. Most of the beneficiaries in coal Depot are migrant labours and resettle in the Govt. lands. Most of the beneficiaries are living in slums and there are very poor Hygiene condition throughout the locality only have two drinking water provision and only one community latrine though that condition of latrine is not well functioning. Liquor abuse is one of the striking problems among the male members of family. Baksara also have a same picture but most of the community members are in minority classes. Lalkuthi is mixed community but many people resettle in Govt. vested land near to DVC canal, many people temporarily construct their Home in canal side. Most of the male members are Daily labours and women are working as a made to others Home. But after intervention of SMCH the situation now little bit improved.

Weighing of Children - Every month SMCS staff weighing children and suggest the mothers for appropriate measure. They discussed about the balance Diet for breast feeding mothers and children above six months of age. Every month they track individual children and make a Growth chart to identify the Growth status of children. As per data they weighing 3102 children and out of that 2395 children are marked as a normal or green levelled baby, 190 children are marked as a Big danger or Red levelled baby and 517 are marked as a danger or Yellow levelled baby. After their intervention the



Red level and Yellow level baby gradually improved their Growth rate. They also recommend Nutrimix is homemade mixture of Wheat, gram flower and mollies mixed with either milk of Hot water.

Vaccination - Staff members are discussed the importance of vaccination with pregnant mother and lactating mother. They also motivate pregnant mothers to register their name in Primary Health centre, BPHC or District Hospital for at least three anti natal check-up and take two tetanus injection before delivery. In awareness programme with community members they share about the immunisation of children after birth like polio, BCG, DTP, PCV, MMR, Rubela, Influenja (Hib B) vaccine, Hepatitis B vaccine etc. Almost 99.9% children now understand the reality and children are covered under this vaccination.





Case Study - Sony Yadav, the daughter of Mina Kumari, was born 20th May 2016, during her birth her weight was 2kg which was far below than normal weight of 2.5 kg and marked as Big Danger. But after the intervention of SMCH she gradually improved her weight and Health condition after six months. She suffers the problem of indigestion for a long time but after the intervention of SMCH staff members she gradually became improved, they first suggest to take boiled water to her children, proper Hand wash with soap before taking food and after defecation. They also suggest to takes different type of green leafy vegetable, protein and balance diet etc.



PRIMARY HEALTH CARE PROGRAM

Impact:

Primary Health Care is about Preventive Medicare program for Vulnerable Women & Children. A contribution to improved living conditions, social status of women and children in the project region. This is a participatory program where women will play a leading role through an effective process of empowerment.

Project Region: Santoshpur Budge Budge, South 24 PGS, Chengail, Howrah, Bhojerhat, Ghatakpukukur, South 24 PGS.

Project Time: April 2019 to March 2021

Project Goals:

- Improvement of sexual and reproductive health of women by awareness and utilization of existing govt. support
- Improvement of child health by preventing avoidable diseases and malnutrition
- Empowerment of women and children to enforce their rights by providing knowledge and support to apply for social rights documents.

Activity:

- Baseline Survey done.
- > Sensitization of community members(women) about the rights of state benefits
- Establishing of women's groups
- Accompanying women for documentation to govt. offices
- Networking with governmental departments
- > Training of CHW's regarding counseling on women's / children's rights.

Present Status:

At present we have finished the baseline survey. By analyzing the data we will have a clear picture of all these area geographically and their domicile nature too. We will have exact evaluation of the present status. In between we have started liasioning with local govt. health dept to plan out some joint program at community level. Soon we will start some outreach camp at community level. Aim is to provide service at base level and to aware them about medical facility available to them.



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
